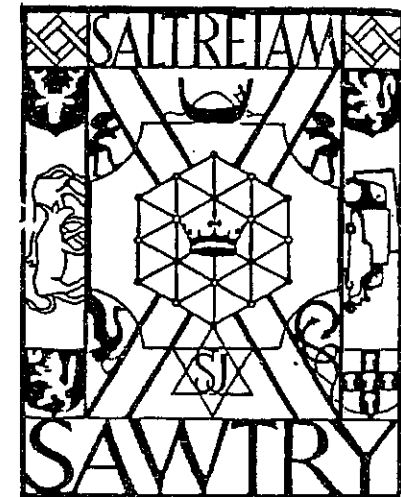

1st SAWTRY SCOUT GROUP

4th December 1967 was the first meeting forming the 1st Sawtry Scout Group and we now celebrate 21 years this year which we, the Group Scout Leaders started, with the backing of Maurice Dybeck and many others in the village.

We started with just 12 boys and soon we expanded to 18, all from our then small village. Now we have 18 Beaver Scouts (6-8), 2 Cub Packs (8-10½), Archers Pack (36 boys), Aversley Pack, (24 boys), 1 Scout Troop (10½-15½) (24 boys) and one Venture Scout Unit which is a mixed group of Girls and Boys aged 15½-20, which ebbs up and down but currently on the up with 10 people.

Over the years we have undertaken all Scout Activities within the village District and County, including many Scout Camps, including Kent, Essex, Nottinghamshire, Yorkshire and Wales.

We undertake such activities as swimming, hiking, canoeing, skiing, gliding and many more.

This year, our 21st birthday we had a Group Camp, which was unfortunately flooded out and also our 21st year we purchased and launched our own canoes and trailer.

All our Leaders are dedicated people to the movement, 17 in all sections led by Mrs C Sampson - Beavers, Mrs Jean Hardy - Archers Pack, Mrs Mary Fountain - Aversley Pack, Mr Arthur Towler - Scout Troop and Mr Brian Parkin who is currently assisting the Venture Unit, since our Leader has left the area.

We have a very strong Group Executive chaired by Mr Chris Gibson, Secretary - Mrs Brenda Bessant and Treasurer - Mr Don Ruff.

No Group with the size that we have, could not look after our own stores and equipment without a Quartermaster - Mr Mike Hardy.

Finally we must say that we have now made a name for ourselves with our gigantic sales twice a year and to celebrate our 21 years of scouting in Sawtry we have produced our own mugs with purchase price of only £1.50 each, so if you want one please contact me, Mervyn Donne, Group Scout Leader.

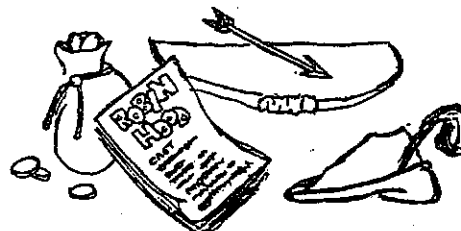

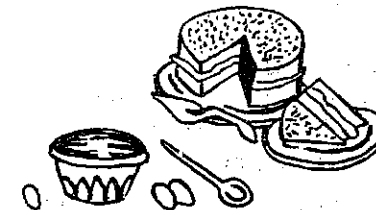

Recipe

Coffee-cream suprise

Ingredients

1pkt sponge fingers (36) 1pt. whipped cream
 1 quantity of made up, strong black coffee, rum to taste
 small quantity of chopped walnuts

Method

Dip sponge fingers into coffee-rum liquid. Do not leave too long as sponge will disintegrate. Arrange fingers in four sets of four on an oblong serving dish. Add one layer of whipped cream, and sprinkle some chopped nuts on to this. Repeat this process twice more. Coat the oblong 'cake' with the rest of the cream. Put into refridgerator until required. Naughty but nice!
