CAMBRIDGESHIRE CONSTABULARY

Several premises throughout the County have been entered by persons posing as officials from various authorities, such as Council and Water Board.

Once inside the properties, usually occupied by elderly persons, they steal valuables and cash by means of distraction. One person distracts the occupant whilst another searches the house. If anyone visits your premises purporting to be an official from any authority, he should not be admitted unless you are perfectly satisfied with the identity card bearing the officials name and picture. If they are unwilling to produce this DO NOT LET THEM IN. If you are unsure of any caller, ring the Police on 0480 5611 and areolice Officer will be only too pleased to check the caller out for you. Remember, if in doubt, do not admit anyone into your home.

If you have any elderly people living near you, please make sure that they are aware of this situation and keep a friendly eye, on them. If we all do this then maybe we will keep Sawtry free from these "undesirables".

After the Supper of 1968 when over one hundred of our guests had enjoyed another excellent evening of good food, superbenertaloment and swopped many a tale of times past; some of which had got more interesting as the years went by "and do you remember when H . . . etc : Some of us do but I can statelist hat one:







At long last the first positive steps have been made to provide the sports clubs of Sawtry with their own facilities. Thanks to the efforts of the Parish Council, land has been purchased across the Ai Trunk Road on Sawtry Fen for organised sporting activities.

The Football, Cricket and Ladies Hockey Clubs have long been campaigning for better quality playing surfaces in the village. The present pitches at the Sawtry Village College leave a lot to be desired because they lie waterlogged for many of the winter months. It is true to say that due to the poor drainage there, many Hockey and Football games have to be postponed or played away, thus forfeiting the home advantage, much to the annoyance of footballers and hockey players alike.

The Football Club is lucky enough to be backed up by the pitch on Gidding Road, which is kindly loaned to them by local farmer and Football Club President Dick Hunting. However, without proper facilities to augment the playing surface Sawtry Football Club still does not possess a ground to be proud of. They would dearly love to develop the site up Gidding Road, but alas that doesn't seem possible. The Hockey and Cricket Clubs both have similar stories of woe to tell.

So, the news that Sawtry Farish Council are prepared to spend some money on sports field development is cheerfully welcomed by the three clubs. The site the Council has chosen is, however, going to require a lot of work before it is suitable for sporting activities. As local farmer Dick Hunting recalls "It used to take B horses to pull a hay cart through that field when I used to farm there. It's one of the wettest parts of the village!" The sports clubs are prepared to wait a few seasons though, they don't want another set of college fields!

According to Parish Councillor Dick Tuplin the matter of drainage, levelling and seeding is in hand. A survey has already been completed and the council are prepared to spend approximately \$55,000 which will provide for two top class playing surfaces, which will be playable even when it rains. This will allow enough area for at least one full sized football pitch, a hockey pitch and a cricket square with further space for two more pitches levelled and seeded. It has to be stressed though that the price tag for this work of \$55,000 is an estimated cost and true figures have yet to be received from the tender. A \$20,000 grant has been received from the District Council to help towards the cost, but, it is nice to know that the Parish Council are committed to improving Sawtry sporting facilities and have demonstrated this by already spending \$40,000 on the purchase of the field and the initial survey which alone cost \$750.

As you can imagine the sports clubs are delighted, but there is still much work to be done. The cost to construct a pavilion and changing rooms has yet to be looked into. Who will pay for mains water, sewage, gas and electric supplies to be installed? It certainly will not be cheap. With the Parish Council covering the cost of the field preparation it looks as though the three sports clubs are faced with the mammoth task of fund raising to build the sports pavilion.

So, what are the three clubs prepared to do? Well, they have already joined forces and have set up a "Build Sawtry a Sports Ground" Fund which will be used to improve the three clubs sporting facilities in the village, and to open their fund raising ventures they are organising a Sawtry Extravaganza which will take place on Saturday 15 July at the Sawtry Village College commencing at 10am and finishing at 5pm. The event is centered around a charity football match organised by local

sports star Robbie Cooke. He now plays football for Kettering Town, who have had a tremendous season, but in the past he has had spells with Millwall, Brentford, Cambridge and Peterborough. Robbie is bringing to Sawtry some professionals and ex-professionals to take on a Sawtry team. Also on the day there will be a Sawtry Youth five-a-side football competition, a senior competition involving local clubs, a chariot race challenge and the Greystones Mens Aerobics display team.

Also, there will be stalls, side-shows, attractions, beer tent, jazz band, Fieldsahead B-B-Q and Donuts, a Craft Fair, Teas and Coffees and a Car Boot Sale. In addition there will be childrens races, a bouncy castle, novelty ride, pony rides and much, much more. And, to round off the event, in the evening there will be a 60/70s Night Dance featuring the superb group Goldrush and the excellent John Robb Disco. The Fieldsahead B-B-Q will also be there sizzling throughout the evening adjacent to the college hall. (Tickets will be \$ 3 for the Dance).

The three sports clubs will not only be raising money for their own fund, some of the money raised on the day will go to the Liverpool FC Relief Fund. Additionally, all the clubs, societies and organisations running stalls on the day will be raising money for their own funds and local charities.

All in all, it is the recipe for a fun day out for all the family in Sawtry. Lets just hope for good weather!
